Last year, the public schools of Washington were in their final year of using the state assessment known as the Measurement of Student Progress (MSP) for elementary students grades 3 -8. At the high school and middle school students were given End of Course Assessments (EOC) and at the high school only students took the High School Proficiency Exam (HSPE). These assessments are one indicator of how well students have successfully mastered the standards in core academic areas. Scores are used by educators to provide information regarding specific learning and program needs. Also, educators have used results as one indicator to help create student growth goals on the evaluations.
